
EDITOR MOVES! WHAT WILL HAPPEN NOW!




This issue the Yeti Crab

The yeti crab is this term's weird crab. It lives at the bottom of the ocean and feeds on the nutrients that come up from these cracks in the sea floor, called hydrothermal vents, by catching them in their hairy claws. They live so deep down that no light reaches them so these crabs must survive on the heat of the vents making them one of the only animals that could survive without the sun. All the animals on the surface (including us!) need the light and heat of the sun to survive but since the yeti crab never even sees sunlight it would do just fine! A yeti crab is about 15cm long and can live for up to 20 years! The yeti crab is so different to any other animal that scientists gave them their own family, the Kiwa family and there are currently 4 different types of yeti crabs. The first one, Kiwa hirsuta, was discovered of Easter Island, in the pacific, in 2006. With technology advancing a new species was found the very next year in Costa Rica. The new species, Kiwa puravida, would be joined by Kiwa tyleri in 2010. This yeti crab lives all the way down in the East Scotia Ridge, just north of Antarctica and just east of Argentina. The last one, Kiwa araonae was discovered in 2013, in-between Australia and Antarctica. (I kind of cheated with the yeti crab as it is not a crab but a species of its own but it is called a crab and is pretty cool)!

is a least 1 human. How many werewolves are there?


